With the Memorial Day Holiday just around the corner it's time to start thinking about swimming, summer activities, and picnics and barbecuing!

I'd like to take this opportunity to provide a few reminders in regards to the above. This year there is a new pool management company with new lifeguards and supervisors The American Pool Company has been awarded the contract for the 2014 season. As a reminder...please remember to bring your pool passes and surrender them to the pool guard upon entering the facility. Entrance to the swimming pool should be made through the bathhouse main gate and all residents are required to shower before entering the water. Pool rules and regulations as well as hours of operation are available in the management office should you desire to receive a duplicate copy.

There is nothing like the flavor of grilled food! The barbecuing areas (residents are to supply their own grills) are located on the plaza deck in three separate locations. Two areas on the Northeast side of the Plaza and one area in the Northwest plaza near the handicapped bath facility. Please remember to clean up your grill and area. Never leave burning embers unattended. If your grill is in disrepair please contact Mr. Serry for removal and disposal.

The elevator project is proceeding on schedule as planned.

Unfortunately, when the first lift on Pitt Street was removed from service the individual lift on St. Asaph Street failed and was taken out of service. It took many man hours and several technicians to troubleshoot the problem make repairs and get it back in service. We thank you for your patience. Hopefully this repair will last until the renovation of that lift is completed.

LEARN TO FOLLOW THE RULE... IT SAVES LIFE AND MONEY

It all started as I was heading home at the end of the day. After locking the office, I turned around heading to my car in the garage; I spotted a contractor worker leaving the elevator with his equipment, heading to the main door to exit the building. I told him to use the loading dock door instead. He paid me no attention. He grabbed a couple of his tools and headed for the main door. By the time he came back for the rest of his equipment, I was there and tried to stop him from going through the main door again. This was the time when all hell got loose. He dropped his equipment and became very agitated. He said he would beat me up if I ever touch him again. He repeatedly tried to exit the building through the lobby door, and I just stood at the door way and told him he would have to go through me to get out of the building. He finally went out through the loading dock. When I went out with my car to get his company's number from his truck, he grabbed two business cards, opened my passenger side door and through them at me and then slammed the door. He repeated this several times cursing until I had to move away in a hurry. His co-worker did nothing to stop him but was very apologetic. I feel like this guy would have done me harm if had he had a weapon.

The incident described above is one of many that I have encountered with contractors. However, none is a match in violence to this. This, and all others, would have been prevented if the proper procedure was followed by unit owners and/ or their agents. Lots and lots of owners do construction in the building without following the rules. It is understandable that not all projects need Board approval.

However, it is the rule, for the safety of the residents and staff, and for the proper upkeep of the property, to have all contractors use the loading dock, especially when they are carrying tools and equipment. This can only be effective if owners are willing to abide by it.

My appeal to all owners and residents is to please make sure that all contractors working on the Pitt Street side only have access to the building through the loading dock. All owners and residents have to do is give contractors the key to the loading lock. For those on the St. Asaph Street side, please let your contractors know that the only alternative is to use the side door by the swimming pool gate. Remember that St. Asaph Square is your property. The right and responsibility to protect and maintain its value is yours, but no other person else.

- Residents are requested not to use the entryway rugs to keep the door open while checking their mailboxes. Doing so causes unnecessary wear on the new rugs. Your cooperation is appreciated.
- Residents are reminded not to park in designated parking spaces unless they have the owner's prior approval. Visitors who use the outdoor visitors' parking spots need to register these vehicles with the office. If the office is closed, please put a sign on the

dashboard indicating which unit the car is visiting. The complex reserves the right to tow non-registered vehicles.

- There is a NO SMOKING policy in common areas of Saint Asaph Square, including open air balconies.
- Please ensure that all trash and recycling is placed in the receptacles in the trash room and that trash and chute rooms are kept free of non-bagged waste. Boxes should be flattened before placing in receptacles. Note: Single Stream Recycling is in effect.
